- 1. To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Vaidya Yagya Dutt Sharma Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Opposite Dharpa Power House, Distt. Bulandshahar, G.T. Road, Khurza- 203131, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0253) inspection was conducted on 27.03.2025 & 28.03.2025 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Asessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 14 seats in 02 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Shalya Tantra 10 seats and ii) Prasuti & Stri Roga 04 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.
- 2. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate and Postgraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024 and Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda Regulations 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria, due to the following shortcoming:
 - a) Teaching staffs :- Available staff is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}}$ x100% = $\frac{43}{45}$ x100% = 95.55%.

- 3. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the 121th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 25.04.2025. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, the Board discussed and decided to provide an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARB-ISM letter (Hearing notice) of even number dated 08.05.2025 to appear before the designated Hearing Committee on 14.05.2025, to present their case and to show cause as to why not the permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 14 seats in 02 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Shalya Tantra 10 seats and ii) Prasuti & Stri Roga 04 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2025-26. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter no. Vydsam/2024-25/11828 hearing, dated 12.05.2025 against the deficiencies conveyed to them.
- 4. Whereas, the college through its representatives, Prof. Dr. A.K. Dwivedi, Principal and Director Vaidya Gopal Das Sharma. of the college, appeared before the Hearing Committee on 14.05.2025 and made their submission virtually as well as written, against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

We are requesting to considering above facts& issue of annual permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 11 seats in 02 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga – 04 seats (ii) Shalya Tantra – 07 seats for the academic session 2025-26.

Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and the assessment report was duly placed before the 123rd Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 23.05.2025 and Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the concerned acts and regulation but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 in UG (BAMS) course and also observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission in 01 PG course due to deficiency of required teaching staff for PG namely Shalya Tantra as per the Concerned Acts and regulations. Further the Board also observed that the college is not fulfilling the criteria for extended permission in accordance with regulation 54(2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, as a monetary penalty was imposed on the college as per section 28(1)(f) of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic year 2024-25. However, Board decided to issue Yearly permission in UG BAMS cource with intake capacity of 100 seats as per Regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 & Yearly permission in 01 PG cource in the subject namely Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga - 04 seats as per regulation 15(7) (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024 and Yearly permission in 01 PG cource in the subject namely Shalya Tantra-07 seats [instead of 10 seats] as per approved Seat Reduction Policy approved in 122nd Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 14.05.2025 in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2025-26, wherein it is mentioned that:-

As per the seat reduction policy 2025-26:-

i) For PG Course:-

As per sub-Regulation 2 of Regulation 19 of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, The Teacher student ratio shall be subject to availability of student-Postgraduate guide in the ratio of 3:1, for three students for one Professor; in case of Associate Professor 2:1 two students for one Associate Professor; and in case of Assistant Professor the ration is 1:1 one student for one Assistant Professor.

<u>In the Department of Shalyatantra</u> — The, college is having 05 eligible teaching faculties, 01 Professor, 02 Assosisate professer & 02 Assistant Professor and there is shortcoming of 01 professor for PG and the available Assistant Professors do not have more than 05 years of teaching experience. Hence, As per the available faculty the college is not fulfilling the teacher student ratio as per the submitted seats in Part-1 but is eligible for issuance of permission for only 07 seats instead 10 seats.

6. Hence, after applying the seat reduction policy 2025-26 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, the college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of Yearly Permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) as per regulation 54(3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and Yearly permission in 02 PG course in the subject namely i) Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga – 04 seats and ii) Shalya Tantra-07 seats [instead of 10 seats] as per Regulation 15(7) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations 2024.

"DECISION"

7. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, Vaidya Yagya Dutt Sharma Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Opposite Dharpa Power House, Distt. Bulandshahar, G.T. Road, Khurza- 203131, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0253) is hereby granted with:-

8.

 a) Yearly permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and;

b) Yearly permission in 01 PG cource in the subject namely Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga – 04 seats for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 15(7) (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024;

- c) Yearly permission with seat reduction policy in 01 PG cource in the subject namely Shalya Tantra-07 seats [instead of 10 seats] for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 15(7) (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024;
- 9. The aforementioned Permission is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-
 - It is informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 11 Seats [instead of 14 seats] in each 02 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
 - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatary Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 10. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

- 11. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 12. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 13. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2025 as per Regulation 55 (2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and Regulation 15(9)(b) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda Regulation, 2024 compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2026-2027:
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
 - iv) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - v) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 4 above, shall be fulfilled.
- 14. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
